## Pledge of Conduct

To ensure the atmosphere of the event is competitive, but based on the principles of fair play and sportsmanship and in the best interest of the event, I pledge, as a player and parent of this team, I support the following rules of conduct, which will be enforced during the 2012 Lacrosse season:

The rules governing this event state that both teams will honor and respect all calls made by referees. Once an issue or disagreement has been settled and play resumes, the situation is finished and should not be revisited. If a dispute occurs at the end of a game, that issue should be settled prior to leaving the field.

Fighting will not be tolerated. The referees/coaches/school staff reserve the right to interrupt any game which they deem is not within the bounds of fair play or sportsmanship.

Physical/verbal abuse toward a referee, another player, spectators or coaches will result in dismissal from the game of coaches, players and a removal of a parent from the field.

Crowd support and encouragement during games is welcomed and encouraged. However, inappropriate, rude or confrontational behavior by spectators may lead to disqualification of their team from the game at the referees' sole discretion.

The Event Staff will remove anyone who does not abide by the Competition Principals.

Spectators will observe games at least 10 feet from the sideline of the field, on the side that is opposite of the team. Spectators are not to be on the same side of the field as the players at any time.

## Academic Policy

During preseason and up until the beginning of second semester Del Webb Middle School Lacrosse will adhere to the Clark County School District Academic Policy of a 2.0 grade point average and passing four (4) classes.

At the beginning of the second semester, to maintain game eligibility and participatory status students/athletes participating in Del Webb MS Lacrosse must pass all six classes and maintain a 2.0 grade point average. Beginning the second week of the second semester each player must turn in their printed grade report from Parentlink every Friday morning before school to the basket on Mrs. Serbenta's desk in the Dean's Office. If a student has a "D" or "F" in any class or has failed to turn in a grade report, they will be placed on Academic Probation for one week. A player on academic probation will be required to stay after school for two days during the probation week to complete make-up work and class requirements to raise their grade. If at the end of the week the grade has improved to a "C" average, the student will be deemed off Academic Probation. **If, however, the grade in the class has not improved to a "C", the player will NOT be eligible to participate in games the following week.**
